Musician Payment Policy

Policy Statement

- 1. This document is intended to rationalise and set out the orchestra's current practice for payments to professionals including conductor and soloists, the leader, and additional players.
- 2. It will be reviewed on an annual basis by the Committee prior to the preparation of the budget for the season ahead.
- 3. It distinguishes 3 categories of players:
 - a. Professional. In the case of professionals we recognise that this is their livelihood, and the fee and expense rates below are informed by the Making Music /Musicians Union Fee agreement (2022). In this context, professionals should be taken to be musicians for whom performing is their primary source of income.
 - b. Students. We also seek to recompense students appropriately, recognising their financial circumstances.
 - c. Non-professional but experienced players known to members. We are very appreciative when additional players do not request fees or full expenses.
- 4. It is recognised that there may be situations which arise where payment rates are varied for specific reasons. The Committee reserves the right to review and agree any such variations prior to confirmation of the proposed fee for individual musicians which must be approved by the Hon Treasurer and President in advance.
- 5. Payment of expenses:
 - a. If an invited extra professional player lives out-with the 30 mile radius as defined by the MM agreement we will pay the agreed rates. (see footnote)
 - b. However, in general, to a) minimise the budgetary impact and also to reduce the orchestra's carbon footprint, we aim to engage more local players where musically acceptable. Any exceptions should be agreed with the Hon Treasurer in advance.
 - c. The starting point for agreeing "Reasonable expenses" is therefore the return rail fare form Glasgow, per trip.
- 6. "Final rehearsal" This is referred to in the table below and is usually held on the concert day, in which case only one set of travel expenses and/or porterage will be paid.

Extract from the Making Music / Musicians Union Fee Agreement relating to Travel Expenses, noting that Glasgow is less than 30 miles from Helensburgh:

6. TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES

If the engagement is for a concert or rehearsal at a venue which is over thirty miles from the musicians home (their recognised centre of employment) and alternative transport is not provided and paid for by the engager, a travelling allowance of **45p per mile** shall be paid for all miles necessarily travelled in reaching, fulfilling and returning from the engagement.
